Making a DNA connection

This is intriguing for me. Crystal is my sister. Hoping I can make the connection via DNA to royalty. I still remember back in the 80's when both my sis and Sara were young (They are about the same age), Sara was just married to the Prince Andrew and was in the wedding news quite often. Many people thought my sis was Sara Ferguson. You can see why AncestryDNA is seeking physical traits to add to the DNA connections.

I once read an article that stated Sara Ferguson has cousins here in America, and some of her kin came to Massachusetts during the 1600s during the great migration. I found that our Ferguson line also spent time in Colonial America in Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New York about 1650.

Famous Kin

Although Sarah Ferguson became the Duchess of York when she married Prince Andrew, she has no shortage of royal ancestors and cousins in her own family tree. She is a direct descendant of King Edward I, King Henry VII, and has family connections to King Henry VIII and most of his wives. Sarah Ferguson has a number of kinships to the current royal family including Queen Elizabeth II, Princess Diana, and Catherine Middleton. She also has a family connection to Mayflower passenger Richard More.

Sarah Ferguson's family tree is littered with leading figures from important events throughout British history. This includes, but is not limited to, Sir Winston Churchill, Sir George Downing, Lt. Gen. James Budenell (led the "Charge of the Light Brigade"), Edmund Waller (English poet and politician), Charles Darwin, Fletcher Christian (leader of the mutineers on the *Bounty*), and Major John Pitcairn (British commander at the Battle of Lexington).

Sarah Ferguson also has a number of kinships to prominent Americans including Alexander Hamilton, explorer Meriwether Lewis, *Twas the Night Before Christmas* author Clement Moore, American patriot Patrick Henry, General Douglas MacArthur, author Helen Keller, artist Norman Rockwell, poet Ralph Waldo Emerson, and General Robert E. Lee. Her U.S. Presidential kin include George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Madison, John Quincy Adams, Zachary Taylor, William Howard Taft, and Benjamin Harrison. Some of her celebrity kin include Olivia De Havilland, Dick Van Dyke, Christopher Reeve, Randolph Scott, Janis Joplin, Chevy Chase, Dick Clark, and countless others.

In my own gathering of who I am related to (using the former Ancestry's "Were Related" app it also stated) that I was related to Sir Winston Churchill, Sir George Downing, and most of the U.S. Presidents listed in Sarah's ancestry. I am also cousins with Patrick Henry, Helen Keller, and Norman Rockwell. But since the Ferguson early periods of coming here aren't well documented, I may never know the direct connection, but I know it's there. This is the fun of DNA. I have connected DNA with people who also claim their ancestry in this same direction. Just like I am connected to my loyalist Canadian cousins up north, I know we are related. My Fergusons were in Dutchess County New York, part of the Beekman Patent. The Revolutionary war split some of the family apart. Some left for Ontario and some stayed in New York later to go back down to Michigan and west and the other line from New York to Iowa then Nebraska where I am from.

Revolutionary War soldier Samuel Ferguson 1744 – 1825. I came across an indirect DNA to Samuel Ferguson through a marriage line. It certainly sparked my interest being somehow related. He is certainly a great American Patriot. He was on the opposite side of Major Patrick Ferguson the loyalist at Kings Mountain. His birthplace is Ireland according to a descendant who applied for Sons of the Revolution. However, I am very disappointed in some family trees that suggest his line is from the Kilkerran branch with no real evidence. So just beware.




























Treasury Report by Steve Butler

Clan Ferguson Society of North America Treasurer's Report through December 31, 2019

Good Day, Clan Members,

Attached is a spread sheet showing the Balance Sheet of all accounts, Income and Expenses, and the value of the two Charitable Foundation funds of the Society through December 31, 2019. I did this so you, our members, have an idea of our value and it would make *The Bee Line* winter issue. I will prepare a mid-year summary for the Summer. 2020, issue.

First, we had a good year. Income, mostly from memberships, exceeded expenses. Please keep recruiting. The more members, the more vibrant the society, the more friends and clan members you make. Attend your local games and help out the conveners and regional vice presidents. If possible, become a convener and set up a booth at your closest local games. Your RVP will help you get a start. Booths don't have to be fancy, just a presence. Our Quarter Master, David Ferguson, will provide a standard start up booth kit. Direct expenses attributed to setting up a booth are reimbursable.

Second, the interest we earned on the two Vanguard funds purchased additional shares in each fund. The value of the shares varies from day-to-day based on end-of-day market values. This is a reason the interest earned and transfer amounts are not the difference between starting and ending fund values.

Third, our major expense is *The Bee Line*. We encourage all those with email accounts to receive it digitally.

Finally, I would like to step down at the end of 2020. If anyone is interested in taking over the position notify Eric Ferguson, our president, who will forward it to the nominating committee. You will be placed on the ballot at the AGM. The position is not difficult. Mostly, it comprises collecting dues, writing checks for festivals, games, and reimbursing officers for their expenses. The other major item is tracking our Charitable Foundation monies through Vanguard.

The Fergusson Double S

How the double S in Fergusson disappeared.



Once in a while at a Fergus(s)on gathering there would be a person that insists the Fergusson double "ss" is the correct spelling versus the single "s" Ferguson. The "ss" is said to be the original spelling. Although they are of the same people this can sometimes trend to a heated debate as I learned.

So how did the double "ss" turn into the single "s"?

As pictured on the left is a coat of arms of a Fergusson written in a "long S" and a small "s" in italicized script handwriting. You can notice the large italicized "S".

In the U.S. <u>Bill of Rights</u>, the word "Congress" is similar with the long "S"



Paraphrased from https://www.grammarly.com/blog/history-of-long-s/, The origins of the long s, f, can be traced all the way back to old Roman cursive, a script used in Rome for every day, informal writing from the first century AD to about the third century. In this script, the letter "s" was written as a vertical downstroke with a small curve at the end of it, and a diagonal upstroke at the top. It looked almost like a check mark, with an added diagonal line on top of it. In new Roman cursive, which developed between the third and seventh century AD, "s" was written almost as we write the lowercase r today: a vertical downstroke, followed by an upstroke with a curve. This was the type of "s" that found its place in the Carolingian script, which was developed in the court of Charlemagne in order to provide a uniform and legible form of writing. It's in this script that the r-like form evolved into the long "s" we see in the Bill of Rights. (continued)

If you're wondering what the "s" we know and use today was doing during that time, don't worry, it was there. It's just that it was used as the uppercase "S", mostly, up until the **eleventh or twelfth** century. Around that time, the long "s" started to be used when the letter appeared at the beginning or in the middle of a word, and by the **fifteenth century**, this practice seemed to become established.

The way the long "s" was used changed over time. The Bill of Rights dates to the **late eighteenth century**, and in it the long "s" appears only in words that have a double "s".

The late eighteenth century saw the long s dropped en mass from printed works. By the early nineteenth century, most printers had only one type of "s" in their arsenal—the short one—and the people who made the type for the printing presses stopped making the long "s". The process was slower and more gradual in handwriting, though, where the long "s" hung on until the second half of the nineteenth century.

Why did the long "s" have to go away? Well, if you think about it, it makes perfect sense. The long "s" and the short "s" both represent the same sound, so you have an unnecessary doubling of letters. If you had to choose between the two, would you choose the one that's easily confused with the letter f or would you choose the one that can't be confused with any other letters? You'd choose the letter that makes it easier to read, and that's the short "s". Still, it's good to know the history of the long "s", if for no other reason than to understand why it appears in the Bill of Rights.


